EFL-28: **INTENSIVE ENGLISH**

After 20 standard morning lessons you will study a further 8 lessons per week from a choice of specialised options in the afternoons. You also receive a free tutorial with your teacher each month, and access to the full free activities programme.



CE-28: **COMBINATION ENGLISH WITH 1-TO-1**

After 20 standard morning lessons you will study a further 8 lessons per week with your own private teacher in the afternoons. You will also receive a free tutorial with your teacher each month, and access to the free activities programme.



EFL-20: STANDARD ENGLISH

Morning classes make up the whole 20 lessons for Standard English each week. It is ideal if you prefer to have your afternoons free. You will also receive a free tutorial with your teacher each month, and access to the full free activities programme.

4Ages

- Ages 16 & 17 must be in class in the mornings and afternoons, therefore they may not book morning-only lessons (EFL-20)
- If you are aged 18 + years, all your classmates will be aged at least 16 years.
- At certain times of year morning classes are also attended by our Sir George camp students aged 14 to 17. At this time, if you are aged 16 or 17 years, some of your classmates may be aged 14 or 15.

Levels

Students attending our Sir George camp must be at elementary level or above. For all other courses we welcome students from beginner to advanced levels of English. On the rare occasion that there are not enough students to form a beginner's class, we will offer private lessons (at a reduced ratio) until a suitable class is available. IELTS-28: **EXAMINATION COURSE**

You will study 28 lessons per week of intensive IELTS examination preparation - 20 lessons in the morning and 8 in the afternoon. You also receive a free tutorial with your teacher each month, and access to the full free activities programme.

CAM-28: **EXAMINATION COURSE**

You will study 28 lessons per week of intensive Cambridge examination preparation - 20 lessons in the morning and 8 in the afternoon. You also receive a free tutorial with your teacher each month, and access to the full free activities programme.

SG-28 - SIR GEORGE CAMP FOR AGES 14 TO 17 YEARS

During the academic year (August to June) we run our Sir George camp for teenagers at Studio main school. METHODOLOGY

We adapt our teaching to the needs and learning styles of our students, following three guiding principles:

- The teaching will be balanced with practice you will learn and practise English, with an emphasis on speaking.
- Lessons will be centred around you you will not spend all your time listening to the teacher but will be busy using English in the classroom.
- The language we teach will be recycled we will not allow you to forget what you have learnt.







STUDY LONGER FOR LESS

Our courses cost less per week the longer you study. See our Dates and Fees list for information. If you are staying for 4 weeks or more, you can move from the EFL 28 course to our examination courses as you progress in your studies.

CLASSES AT THE RIGHT LEVEL

Classes are at all levels from beginner to advanced. You will be tested on your first day by a qualified teacher, with a written and speaking test and then placed in a class at the level which is right for you. You will be able to change level as you progress by discussing with your teacher and the Director of Studies.

The table (left) shows the six main levels we use and the equivalent levels in the Cambridge Assessment Examinations, TOEFL and IELTS.

Progress test

At the end of each week you will take a test to make sure that you have understood the work covered during the week. You will be able to see your improvement.

Exit test

At the end of your course you can take an exit test. This will measure your level of English at the end of your course and, by comparing the results with those of your placement test, your overall progress. We will give you an additional certificate to show this progress.

Tutorials

A tutorial is a private meeting with your teacher, in which you can discuss the progress you have made and what you need to do next to reach your goals.

Your Study Plan

Based on the personal goals identified in your tutorials and your work in class, your teacher will give you a personalised Study Plan. This will guide you to work on those areas of English which you need to focus on to improve your command of the language.

Certificate of Studies and Academic Report

At the end of your course you will receive a certificate showing the course you have studied and the dates of that course.

Your teacher will also write a personalised Academic Report which shows not just your progress but also the level you have attained in each area of English. This is a very useful document for your future studies or work.

Modern technology

Lessons regularly incorporate modern media, such as video clips, webpages, social media and the latest news, through which we can bring the English-speaking world into our classrooms.

Self-study in the Learning Centre

You can visit our main school Learning Centre before or after lessons to work on the areas identified in your Study Plan. We have 20 PCs with free internet access and Wi-Fi, printing facilities, and a range of materials including CDs, books and newspapers.

Homework

Homework is set daily by your teacher and is designed to complement your classroom studies, helping you to retain and practise the new language from your lessons and to make faster progress.

Activities and out-of-school assignments

Our courses – EFL-20, EFL-28, CE-28, IELTS-28 & CAM-28 - all offer at least 5 afternoon activities, and 1 evening activity, each week, completely free of charge.

We also have some other clever ways of keeping you talking through our Studio "missions", Conversation club and Grammar club (see page 5).

Studio Cambridge Course Choices

EFL-20

Morning lessons only

Our morning classes are attended by all students on Standard, Intensive, or Combination courses. All offer General English skills, with no specialisation. They consist of 20 lessons each week, typically from 09:30 to 13:00 each day, Monday to Friday. The content of the morning classes differs according to the level, interests and age of the students in each class. However, all include the study of grammar, speaking, listening, pronunciation, writing skills and reading comprehension.

CE-28 COMBINATION ENGLISH WITH 1-TO-1

Morning lessons plus afternoon 1-to-1 tuition

Each week CE-28 offers 20 morning English lessons in international classes, plus 8 afternoon lessons of 1-to-1 tuition with your own private teacher. You also receive access to the free activities programme. Your 1-to-1 lessons can focus on any specific areas of grammar, skills or topic of interest to you (to be requested at the time of booking). It is the most effective way to improve your own specific areas of English while still having the advantage of mixing with other students in the morning lessons.


EFL-28 INTENSIVE

Levels







This option is for students who want to use English in a work or business setting. It is a practical course that includes real-world scenarios, simulations and tasks. It looks at areas such as:

- Greetings and small talk
- Formal English for meetings
- Negotiating and persuading

EFL-28 OPTION 3 **ENGLISH FOR ACADEMIC EXAMINATIONS**

Levels (4)(5)







This option is for students who wish to take an English language exam while at Studio or once they return home. Gaining an internationallyrecognised English Language qualification is particularly useful if you are planning to study on a Foundation, Bachelor's or Master's degree course at an English-speaking university. However, this option is also suitable for students who don't need a qualification but would like a very structured and demanding course. The aim of this option is to improve your academic language skills together with your exam techniques. Most medium to long-stay students take this option before moving to the full-time examination course nearer to the date of the exam (see pages 15 & 16).

This option is divided into two or three exam streams, which have some different focuses and also some common areas:

3.A. IELTS PREPARATION

Topics include:

- Delivering a short monologue
- Reacting to a difference of opinion during discussion
- The formal lexis and structures used in academic writing
- · Writing reports on graphs, charts and diagrams
- Taking notes from lectures
- Identifying the writer's claims in scientific texts

3.B. CAMBRIDGE EXAM PREPARATION -**B2 FIRST (FCE) AND C1 ADVANCED (CAE)**

Topics include:

- · Describing and comparing pictures, making suggestions and cooperative dialogue
- Use of grammar e.g. gap-fills, paraphrasing
- Use of vocabulary e.g. synonyms, affixes, phrasal verbs
- · Writing letters, reports, reviews and stories
- Reading comprehension of fiction, magazines and newspapers
- Listening comprehension of news, presentations and everyday conversations

IELTS Examination Course (**IELTS-28**)

The IELTS examination is an internationally recognised qualification, accepted for entry into universities and colleges throughout the English-speaking world.

Our IELTS-28 examination course is designed specifically to cover the skills needed in the IELTS exam and during your university studies.

It has proved to be highly successful, and as all lessons concentrate exclusively on the exam, we only recommend this course to those who intend to take the exam.

Special features of the course

Specialised vocabulary for IELTS:

You will learn and memorise words that typically appear in IELTS exams, in topics such as the environment, technology and geography.

Exam training and practice:

As the exam date approaches, you will receive increasingly more examination practice, including speaking tests and evaluation. We will give you detailed feedback on your performance in each area and will identify the areas you need to improve on in order to achieve your target IELTS score.

help you gain entrance to university, but will help you to successfully manage the demands of a university course.

Levels

The minimum IELTS score for entry to a UK university is usually 6.0 and this course is designed to help you achieve at least that level.

You must already be at a strong intermediate level (IELTS 5.0) to start the course. However, it is also suitable for students aiming for 7.0 or even higher.

If your level of English is below IELTS 5.0 you may wish to start your studies on the EFL-28 course with the afternoon option 3 – English for Academic Examinations: IELTS. You can then transfer to the IELTS-28 course when you are ready.

Teaching knowledge and experience:

We have helped thousands of students achieve the examination scores they have needed for entry to university. Our instructors have received specialist training in IELTS and have expertise and years of experience in helping students achieve their maximum possible scores.

Previous Studio participants taking IELTS-28 have gained successful admission to Oxford, Cambridge and Russell Group Universities.

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Cambridge Examination Course (CAM-28)

These qualifications are among the most prestigious and widely recognised English language qualifications in the world. They are accepted for entry to UK universities - B2 First for Foundation courses and C1 Advanced for Degree courses. The course prepares you for the examinations and they are timed so that the examination takes place shortly before or after the course ends. The speaking examinations are held during the final week of the course. However, some students take the courses without wishing to sit the examinations. The fee for the exams is, therefore, not included in course fees.

Special features of the course

Detailed knowledge of grammar and vocabulary:

Use of English is a crucial part of the exam and the course provides you with a detailed grounding in grammar and vocabulary.



Exam training and practice:

C1 ADVANCED (CAE) LEVELS

As the exam date approaches, you will receive increasingly more examination practice, including speaking tests and evaluation. We will give you detailed feedback on your performance in each area and will identify the areas you need to improve on in order to achieve your target grade in the exam.

Success at University:
