



cultural program

Living in Rome – even for a short time – is a unique experience, full of opportunities. Rome is a lively metropolis, with an exciting cultural scene. The city offers a broad range of events throughout the year to satisfy the tastes of all age groups. It is the world's largest outdoor museum, with hundreds of churches and countless monuments. The following activities are offered on a regular basis:
